## The climbers taking part in *Les trois mousquetons* get set for their grand departure

**MONTREAL, APRIL 3, 2010** – The climbers who will attempt to reach Everest Base Camp (Asia) and the summit of Mount Kilimanjaro (Africa) gathered at Montréal-Trudeau International Airport today prior to their departure, each excited to meet this major challenge. The third group – the team that will attempt to climb Europe’s Mount Elbrous – is slated to fly out on April 6, 2010. Inspired by the 2,000 Quebec children with cancer that dream of recovery, each climber’s participation in this bold expedition is intended to salute the courage of these children.

For **Pierre Bruneau**, spokesman for the Fondation Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau, this grand departure is the culmination of several months of preparation: “I’m extremely proud to embark on this adventure with people who’ve been closely involved for almost eight months and who’re very excited about meeting this challenge and supporting the cause of children with cancer. The determination of our three musketeers, Émilie, Kassandra and Raphaël, will inspire us to surpass ourselves, both physically and psychologically,” he says.

“I’m very pleased to encourage the climbers before their departure, and I hope they reach the summit and that they think of me if they have difficulty,” says **Émilie Dagenais**, an Everest Base Camp musketeer. Aged 11, Émilie is going through a second bout with cancer, in this case with osteosarcoma. She is currently receiving treatment at the Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau at CHU Sainte-Justine. As Émilie has said so often: “If this were easy, it wouldn’t be a challenge . . .”

The Kilimanjaro musketeer, Kassandra Dufour, is 13 years of age. Since November 2009, Kassandra has been in remission following a battle with lymphoblastic leukemia.

Seven-year-old Raphaël Hamel, for his part, has courageously fought lymphoblastic leukemia since the age of 2. He is proud to serve as musketeer for the team attempting to climb Russia’s Mount Elbrous.

### **Financial Objective**

This grand adventure is aimed at raising proceeds of \$1 million in support of the Fondation Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau.

### **Les trois mousquetons**

This is an ambitious project, one that involves the simultaneous ascent of three mountains on three different continents, with all three climbing teams aiming to reach their respective summits on the same day. From **April 3 to 22, 2010**, therefore, three teams of climbers (62 in total) will attempt to reach Everest Base Camp (Asia) and the summits of Mount Kilimanjaro (Africa) and Mount Elbrous (Europe). This adventure is inspired by Athos, Porthos and Aramis, the legendary heroes brought to life by Alexandre Dumas: Courageous and working as one, the famous “One for all and all for one!” will serve as a rallying cry with which each of our climbers will be able to identify.

**Daniel Boucher** will scale the 5,895 metres to the summit of Kilimanjaro, the mythical African volcano. **Pierre Bruneau**, for his part, will join the Asian team for the 5,545-metre climb to the base camp on the world's highest peak. Finally, **Benoît Gagnon** will brave the 5,642 metres to the summit of Mount Elbrous, the highest peak in Europe.

The three summits should be reached on **Thursday, April 15, 2010**.

#### **The 4th summit – Mount-Royal: the Dartagnan Summit**

On April 15, 2010, the three teams of climbers will reach their respective summits (Everest Base Camp, Kilimanjaro and Elbrous). To highlight this rare feat and recognize the sustained efforts of all of our climbers, an ascent of Mount-Royal will be held on the same day. Expected to attend this symbolic event are children at the Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau and their families, public personalities, and friends and family of the climbers.

#### **Mount-Royal Chalet**

The climbers will end their trek at the chalet atop Mount-Royal, where public personalities will be available for interviews, as will children receiving treatment at the Fondation.

The closing ceremonies at the Mount-Royal chalet will also see the spokespersons for each expedition – **Pierre Bruneau, Daniel Boucher** and **Benoit Gagnon** – address the participants from their respective mountain perches via satellite telephone. **André Robitaille** will act as MC.

As the culmination of the project, this event will serve to rally the three expeditions to the cause. It is also on this occasion that the proceeds will be announced.

- 11:30 a.m.** Discussion with spokespersons live from their respective summits
- 11:50 a.m.** Announcement of the proceeds raised
- 12 a.m.** End of the event
